4. Guest Presentation

- i. Brent Nation, Utility Manager for the City of Fort Morgan presented their municipal broadband experience
- **b.** Fort Morgan pop 12,000
- c. Started fiber placement in 2003 with Bean Pole Project along rail road
 - i. Tied to Local, school and county
 - ii. Worked into Electric Utility
 - iii. Ran significant dark fiber
- d. Voted out of SB-152 in 2009, same year as Longmont
- e. Have franchise agreement with Charter for cable services
- f. Ran 3 feasibility studies
- g. Citizens were unhappy with Charter's services and price
- h. 2016 Hired consultants that did the Bean Pole Project
 - i. Supported a middle mile development 1 year time frame
 - ii. Control & operational questions between City Council
 - iii. How to run a technology utility with existing utility staff?
- i. Looked to a P3 option Posted RFI had 7 responses
- j. Backbone was in the ground from 2016 project
 - i. Allo provided the best solution
 - ii. First meeting 7/2017
 - iii. Agreement on 12/2017
 - iv. Design development in 12/2017
 - v. April 2018 contracts with construction company
 - vi. Construction started in June/2018
 - vii. July 2018 First testing customers
 - viii. July 2018 7 GPONS (Gigabyte Passive Optical Network) in town hub connections to customers
 - ix. Finished by Nov/2018 5000 customers

k. Network

- i. City owns the network and leases to Allo 20yrs with additional 10yr options
- ii. Allo runs the service and markets it under Allo
- iii. 30%ish take rate
- iv. \$90 1 gig
- v. \$25 phone
- vi. \$60 300 mg symmetrical offering most popular
- vii. Allo will do market analysis for TV consumption at the end of 2019
- viii. 6000 electric customers, fiber passed 5280 customers
- ix. Fort Morgan owns up to the MST (Multiport Service Termimal) home connection
- x. Allo responsible for customer drop and hardware in the home/business
- xi. Cost of \$5 million for the City to do the build out

I. Allo

- i. SLA agreements with Allo
- ii. Franchise agreement
- iii. Buy out language for connection equipment with in contract

m. Finance

- i. Expected loss as ISP for first 3-5 years
- ii. No debt covered by electric utility funding 5.5 million
- n. Support
 - i. 40 employees to cover ISP Allo/Fort Morgan
- o. Lesson Learned
 - i. Shouldn't have invested in backbone lots of fiber in the ground that is unused
 - ii. Deploy all at once
 - iii. Wait for design to be done before construction begins

- iv. Aerial issues
- v. Electric system improvements ahead of fiber deployment

- a. Number of light poles/electric poles does the City of Greeley have?
 - i. Brian will provide numbers as they are available from utility companies
- b. Do we have lashing agreements with Xcel/PVREA?
 - i. There is not an overarching lashing agreement with the utility providers currently, but that can be negotiated.
- c. What are Low-income options from providers?
 - i. Yes, based on government aid provided to the citizen. They can apply for different discounted broadband packages, based on the provider.
- d. What model would Allo present to the City of Greeley?
 - i. Would be a negotiated model with Allo
