The City of Greeley

is proud to have a long history of water stewardship in Northern Colorado. Since 1893, Greeley has provided safe, high-quality water for customers while ensuring a reliable water supply for the future. Water conservation is one of the many ways Greeley safeguards your water supply by offering one of the most robust water conservation programs in Colorado.

Greeley is situated in a semi-arid climate with just over 13 inches of yearly rainfall, meaning local water supplies are scarce and residents must use water wisely. To help customers save water, Greeley provides several water conservation programs and services that benefit various water users. Please take a few minutes to learn more about these offerings and take the next steps to wise water use.

Greeley offers free water efficiency assessments to help customers identify ways to conserve water. Participation is voluntary and can result in significant water savings.

Indoor Water Assessments [A]

A Greeley Water Conservation staff will come to you to:

- Review your water use
- · Look for leaks and other sources of water waste
- · Check for high water use appliances
- Provide free low-flow showerheads and faucet aerators
- Make recommendations for repairs, upgrades and water use targets

Irrigation Assessments [A]

During the irrigation season, Greeley Water Conservation staff will come to your property to:

- Inspect irrigation system and identify sources of water waste
- Recommend irrigation practices and system improvements
- Measure water pressure and how much water is being used on your landscape
- Provide a customized watering schedule

REBATES

Greeley offers a variety of rebates for water-saving fixtures, equipment and measures.

Toilet Rebates [A]

Customers who replace older inefficient toilets are eligible for a toilet rebate. Proof of toilet recycling increases the rebate amount.

- · Traditional tank toilets
- Commercial flush valve toilets
- Urinals

^{*}Irrigation Rebates [A]

Rebates are available for:

- Smart sprinkler controllers and accessories
- · Weather or soil sensors
- Pressure-reducing valves
- · Pressure-reducing sprinkler bodies
- Rotary nozzles
- Drip conversion kits
- Master valve (case-by-case basis)

Indoor Commercial Rebates [MFR, CII]

Rebates are available for a variety of commercial equipment, such as:

- Bathroom fixtures
- · Kitchen and restaurant equipment
- · Laundry appliances
- Industrial devices

All commercial businesses use water differently, requiring a customized approach. Schedule a commercial water assessment for your business to learn about rebate options.

Life After Lawn [A]

Customers can get rebate to replace existing lawns with low-wateruse plants and grass. This program replaces water-thirsty lawns with more sustainable, attractive, waterwise landscapes.

Landscape Certifications [LIP]

Landscape and irrigation professionals working in Greeley water service area properties qualify for this program. The rebate covers the cost of registration, class materials, and testing fees at the member level of accredited industry associations for qualifying certifications:

- Sustainable Landscape Management (SLM)
- Qualified Water Efficient Landscaper (QWEL)
- Certified Landscape Irrigation Auditor (CLIA)
- Certified Irrigation Technician (CIT)
- Landscape Industry Certified Technician (LICT) Exterior
- Certified Irrigation Contractor (CIC)
- Certified Irrigation Designer (CID)
- Watershed Wise Landscaping Professional (WWLP)







DISCOUNTS & FREE ITEMS

Plants Discounts [SFR, MFR]

During the growing season, Greeley offers discounted Garden In A Box kits that make it easy to plant beautiful, low-water-gardens. Options are available for different sizes and sun exposures. Each kit includes:

- · Low-water plants
- · A professionally designed plant-by-number map
- · Plant care instructions

Free Showerhead Exchanges [A]

Customers can exchange their old showerheads for new low-flow models.

- Showerhead exchanges are held periodically at community events and locations.
- New showerheads are also available through our Indoor Water Assessments.

Free Faucet Aerators [A]

 Aerators are available to all customers through our Indoor Water Assessments and upon request.

ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

Flush and Flow [SFR]

Qualifying customers are eligible for free, low-flow toilet replacements directly installed. However, toilet replacements are limited, and an Indoor Water Assessment must be performed at the property before the installation.

Local Initiative Landscaping and Conservation - LILAC [SFR]

Qualifying customers are eligible for landscape assistance. This initiative aims to enhance yards with water-wise plantings, contributing to the beauty and health of our neighborhoods. It also focuses on assisting underserved customers with their landscape needs. A site visit will be performed at the property to identify the most viable landscape options.

ONLINE WATER EFFICIENCY TOOLS

Water Budget [SFR]

Water rates for single-family homes are calculated using water budgets. A water budget is the amount of water you need each billing period, and it is determined by the number of people in your household, landscape size, and real-time weather conditions. This system ensures you pay the lowest water bill when you use water efficiently.

Tours


Tours of Greeley's water-related facilities and waterwise landscapes can be scheduled for groups of 10 or more.
