

approximately 50 miles north of Denver between the South Platte and Cache la Poudre Rivers, Greeley was founded as the Union Colony in 1869, an experimental utopian society, when Nathan Meeker led the early "Union Colonists." The name was later changed in honor of Horace Greeley, an editor of the New York Tribune and declared a city in 1886. Greeley was primarily an agricultural development, with some of the first successfully irrigated farmland in the state. Agri-business still provides a firm economic base as

- The Greeley Economic Development office makes prospective businesses aware of funding assistance available through local and state incentives and Tax Increment Financing (TIF) to encourage private investment in blighted or declining areas.
- The Weld County Employment Services offers programs that match job seekers to job
 openings as well as provide programs for employers that include tax credits, training/
 education assistance, on-the-job training and subsidized wage opportunities.
