

Greeley Area Recovery Fund is Still Active

Early on during the health and economic crisis, we collaborated with our partners from the Greeley Area Chamber of Commerce, Downtown Development Authority, and East Colorado Small Business Development Center to explore our best options for assisting our local businesses hardest hit by the pandemic. The city committed the first \$250,000 to a recovery fund to provide emergency grants to businesses, based on simple qualifying criteria. The Greeley Area Recovery Fund (greeleyarearecoveryfund.com) has now raised in excess of \$600,000 and has to date, awarded dozens of grants to businesses totaling over \$250,000. These grant funds can be used for marketing, payment of utilities, rent, payroll or other immediate business operating expenses. The top industries served to date have been restaurants, coffee shops and bars, retail and personal services. This relief will continue, even as businesses prepare to reopen in the days and weeks ahead.

Pre-Covid, Athena BioHealth produced a wide range of products and services centered on the growing hemp-based economy. In response to Covid-19, Athena BioHealth is producing gel hand sanitizer packaged both in individual pouches and in large bottles.

Pre-Covid, WeldWerks Brewing Company was an internationally recognized microbrewer of craft beers, while Tower 56 Distilling and Syntax Spirits were both award winning craft spirit distillers. In response to Covid-19, these Greeley businesses have partnered with Pine Bluffs Distilling in Wyoming to produce over 1,500 gallons of hand sanitizer since the beginning of the Covid-19 outbreak. "The Colorado State Youth Council awareded six orgnizations with Tech Bridge arants"


In June, the Colorado State Youth Council (SYC) awarded six organizations with Tech Bridge grants to increase access to technology for Colorado youth. The SYC announced the funding opportunity in late May to address the growing technology divide that hinders Colorado youth from accessino career and education opportunities and decreases their

ability to build the skills necessary to compete in an increasingly technology-enabled workforce. The impact of COVID-19 and efforts to mitigate the pandemic have imposed massive challenges to the economy and the way young people in Colorado train for and secure work. A needs assessment conducted by the Colorado Department of Education found that 55,000 students across the state do not have access to a wi-fi

The SYC received 51 applications for the Tech Bridge grant opportunity. Of these applications, the SYC is excited to announce awards to six organizations.

Homebuyer Assistance Programs

❖ G-Hope

The G-Hope down payment assistance program offers down payment assistance for employees of the City of Greeley, the University of Northern Colorado, North Colorado Medical Center, School District 6, North Range Behavioral Health, Sunrise Community Health, High Plains Library District, JBS, North Colorado Health Alliance, Frontier Academy and Salida Del Sol Academy as an incentive program for a home purchases in targeted neighborhoods. Several neighborhoods east of 35th Avenue qualify, and depending on the neighborhood, up to a maximum of \$6,500 per buyer.

Colorado Housing and Finance Authority (CHFA)

GURA staff can also provide contact information for the Colorado Housing and Finance Authority. which provides down payment assistance to qualified home buyers of any home in Greeley.

Greelev-Weld Habitat for Humanity

The City, through its federal HOME Investment Partnership Program, has long supported the Greeley-Weld Habitat for Humanity program in Greeley. HOME funds assisted buyers in three Habitat subdivisions in Greeley: Habitat North, Crestview, and the newly underway Clover Meadows.


In Northern Colorado a group called NoCo REDI (Northern Colorado Regional Economic Development Initiative) recently published the <u>Northern Colorado Regional Cluster</u>
<u>Strategy</u> to support economic resilience and interconnectedness. Strategies and actions in the plan are meant to act as a playbook for the thirty five separate communities in the region to select the most relevant elements for them while maintaining an aligned strategic direction across the region.

Regional Target Industries

New Business Attraction



Six industry cluster groups were selected as targets for the future growth of the region; these were Bioscience and Medical Devices, Distribution and E-Commerce, Fabrication and Production Technology Manufacturing, Food Processing and Manufacturing, Information Technology, and Plastics. The City's economic development team have supported the effort, seeing particular alignment in Greeley for growth in three of those industry clusters; food processing and manufacturing, fabrication and production technology manufacturing, and plastics. This will help quide our overall business attraction strategy.

While less suitable for a cluster-type growth strategy, our local team has identified three fast-growing sectors that will continue to drive the Greeley economy, These are health services, construction, and tech-enabled business and consumer services. In addition, three mature industry sectors continue to underpin the economic health of the community, These are energy, education, and agriculture.
