## > TRANSPORTATION

• Starting June 8, 2020, the Greeley-Evans Transit resumed reduced, fixed-route bus services and fare collection, using the limited Saturday bus schedule from 7 a.m. – 6 p.m. Monday through Saturday. For a list of schedules go to www.greeleyevanstransit.com or call 970-350-9290. For the protection of GET drivers and passengers, all riders are asked to wear a mask, follow all state executive orders, and ensure they maintain social distancing. The Poudre Express regional commuter route will not operate during these reduced services. The GET Call-N-Ride service will operate from 6 – 7 a.m. and 6 – 9 p.m. Monday through Saturday, and 7:30 a.m. – 1:30 p.m. on Sundays. Riders may schedule Call-N-Ride and ADA Paratransit services up to two weeks in advance by calling 970-350-9290 8 a.m. – 4 p.m. The GET Transit Center, 101 11th Ave., will open for front desk ticket sales from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. starting on June 8.

### > RENTAL HOUSING

On July 12, 2020, Governor Polis issued a new Executive Order that requires that landlords provide tenants with a 30-day notice of default due to non-payment of rent that occurred on or after March 10, 2020 before initiating or filing action for forcible entry and detainer (eviction). During the 30-day period, tenants have a one-time opportunity to cure any default for non-payment that occurred on or after March 20, 2020.

### **Rent Assistance**

Catholic Charities, administrator of rent and utility assistance, is currently accepting requests for rental assistance. Walk-in requests for financial assistance is not provided.

- What to know Call 970-616-8615 to start the process. There are several rental assistance program options; one may be right for your household.
  - There is mandatory paperwork to complete and each program has its own eligibility requirements.

- For Landlords Funds from the Colorado Division of Housing are available for housing assistance from the CARES Act Coronavirus Relief Fund. One provision allows for landlords and/or property owners to seek rental assistance on behalf of their tenants who have experienced financial need on or after March 1, 2020 due to the first or second order effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. Pursuant to the availability of these funds and the Property Owner Preservation (POP) guidelines, landlords and/or property owners may seek payment in arrears for tenants unable to pay their rental obligations.
