


508.00 ARREST WARRANTS

Execution of arrest warrants will be conducted only by sworn officers of the department.

- Execution of municipal court warrants:
 - All warrants will be confirmed as active upon contact with the subject.
 - Warrant service attempts are generally to be done between the hours of 0600 and 2000 hours. Daylight service is encouraged. Special circumstances may not permit the service of a warrant during the above noted times. In such cases a supervisor will be notified and the service approved prior to a warrant being served.
 - If the service attempt is successful, a police report will be completed.
 - Out-of-town municipal court warrants may be executed upon confirmation that the warrant is valid and extraditable.
- Execution of State, out-of-state, and Federal Arrest Warrants:
 - Time: Arrest warrants other than Greeley Municipal Warrants may be executed any time day or night unless limited on the warrant face. The officers should attempt to execute the warrant at a reasonable time, bearing in mind the offense with which the person is charged.
 - Service: If the officer is in possession of an arrest warrant, he should show it to the person at the time of the arrest. If not, the officer will inform the individual of the charges against him.
 - Return: The officer making the arrest should return the warrant to the court which issued it and arrange for the individual to be taken without unnecessary delay before the nearest available county or district judge.
 - State Warrants: In his jurisdiction, an officer may execute a warrant issued by any state court pursuant to Rule 4 of the Colorado Rules of Criminal Procedure.
 - Out-of-State Warrants: An out-of-state warrant is not a warrant in Colorado. However, the officer may use the existence of the out-of-state warrant as probable cause to arrest. The officer will confirm an active warrant prior to arrest and limit his actions to felony warrants only.

GREELEY POLICE DEPARTMENT

- Federal Warrants: Rule 4 of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure permits a state police officer to execute a Federal arrest warrant anywhere in the officer's jurisdiction.
