



Jewelers for Children has awarded a \$20,000 grant to Greeley's Court Appointed Special Advocates Program, also known as CASA (cahsuh). The grant will help recruit and train an additional 15 volunteers and serve at least 37 new children. CASA volunteers, who serve more than 200 Weld County youth each year, work to represent the best interests of abused and neglected children in court.



Greeley has been ranked #33 on the 2017 Safest Cities in Colorado list by the National Council for Home Safety and Security. The ranking is based on the most recent FBI Uniform Crime Report statistics.

Students at Centennial Elementary were awarded a <u>KidsGardening.org</u> Grant for 2017. The school, one of 20 out of more than 500 that applied, received an award package that included a raised bed, growing bag, High Mowing Seeds, garden curriculum books, berry plants, and more. Since 1982,

KidsGardening.org has awarded over 2.9 million dollars to youth gardening initiatives at schools, nonprofits, and youth programs across the U.S.

Kudos to sixty employees at the Weld County Department of Human Services' Child Welfare office for receiving the Colorado C-Stat award. County staff received the award for their speed in assessing child welfare, in cases involving abuse and neglect. C-Stat focuses on and improves performance outcomes within the Colorado Department of Human Services. These employees not only outperformed the state average, they also were one of only six county Human Services Departments in Colorado to receive C-Stat awards.
