





Today we commend Hensel Phelps

SECRETARY OF DEFENSE EMPLOYER SUPPORT FREEDOM AWARD FINALIST RECOGNITION

WHEREAS, almost one-half of the U.S. military is comprised of the Guard and Reserve which are shared by the U.S. Department of Defense with their civilian employers, many of whom provide significant support to their employees who serve in uniform; and,

whereas, recognition of the special service represented by employers who provide outstanding support to their Guard or Reserve employees is bestowed each year in the form of the Secretary of Defense Employer Support Freedom Award; and,

WHEREAS, each year men and women actively serving in the Guard and Reserve, or a family member acting on their behalf, may nominate their employer for the Freedom Award; and,

WHEREAS, in 2017 there were 3,064 nominations submitted nation-wide, of which 69 were for Colorado employers; and,

WHEREAS, Hensel Phelps Construction Company of Greeley, Colorado has been named as one of 30 finalists for the 2017 Secretary of Defense Employer Support Freedom Award, placing the company in the top 1% of the nation's Guard and Reserve-supportive employers.
