<u>Greeley Professional Services Industry 2020 Business Retention & Expansion</u> <u>Analysis Report</u>




Summary: The professional services industry cluster is expected to be Greeley's second fastest growing top industry cluster in the next five years with an additional 1,038 jobs projected. 82% of businesses surveyed during Q4 of 2020 indicated experiencing revenue growth, while 53% had experienced workforce growth. Given the general ability of this industry cluster to operate on a more remote basis, 100% of businesses indicated they had been able to successfully navigate the challenges presented by Covid-19. Over the past year, 71% of companies had established beneficial local business partnerships and 41% developed new products & services or entered into new markets.

As demands on the professional services sector increase, 53% of businesses surveyed indicated attracting qualified talent as their primary challenge with 23% citing difficulties in offering competitive wages. 29% of businesses are positioned for expansion, but limited to their current footprint due to a lack of real estate options in Greeley. Given the multitude of challenges created by Covid, 29% of businesses indicated experiencing supply chain disruptions and 24% were having difficulties keeping up with market demand.

In the year ahead, 59% of businesses surveyed see the opportunity to develop business & industry partnerships. With industry demands on the rise for the foreseeable future, 65% of businesses expect to hire new employees and 47% plan to invest in developing their existing workforce. An additional 47% would like to expand their current facility and 29% are considering opening a new location.
