WHY RECYCLE GLASS?

Glass recycling contributes to the overall health and well-being of communities. It conserves energy and natural resources while also reducing waste.

GLASS4GOOD™ is a program developed by O-I to increase glass recycling in every community in which they operate. Through collaboration with the City of Greeley, residents can safely and properly recycle their glass at two designated collection sites. After processing, the collected glass (cullet) from Greeley's GLASS4GOOD™ program is used at O-I's closest facility and is formed into new glass, sometimes in as little as 30 days. To further impact the community through glass recycling, O-I also provides a charitable donation to United Way of Weld County based on the weight of collected glass.

The Housing Navigation Center's cold weather shelter provided 7,669 nights of stay and served over 15,000 meals from Nov 2021 to April 2022

Over 1,500 Weld and Larimer county households have regained a home through CAHPS since February of 2016



For the most recent program year, 68% of CAHPS participants have maintained housing for over a year.

The Thriving Weld Housing and Land Use Project is reaching out to up to 18 Weld County municipalities to assist them with affordable housing opportunity development
